



THORO-GRAPH, NYRA PARTNER IN CUSTOMERCENTRIC ADW PROGRAM

Delivering concierge-level support and giving higher-volume horse bettors access to rebates, on-track visitation amenities, and handicapping product discounts is the backbone of a relatively new partnership between performance figure provider Thoro-Graph and the New York Racing Association (NYRA).

Thoro-Graph Player Services (TGPS), which launched in May, is a free membership-based online portal that links to the national advance deposit wagering (ADW) site NYRA Bets (access it here).

The alignment of the two entities now gives Thoro-Graph an exclusive ADW partner, and it gives NYRA Bets a valuable pipeline of new bettors who might not have signed up for an account without being incentivized by the perks TGPS is promoting to sweeten the deal.

According to Jeff Franklin, the director of player services & business development for Thoro-Graph, those incentives include "the big five": 1) Competitive rebates; 2) Free and discounted Thoro-Graph sheets; 3) Free NYRA parking, admission, and premium seating for qualifying players; 4) Contact with the NYRA Bets "key account desk"; 5) A personal account manager.

Franklin has worked diverse gigs in the racing industry before taking over the management of TGPS.

ARROGATE DRAWS POST THREE IN SAN DIEGO

Champion and "TDN Rising Star" Arrogate (Unbridled's Song) drew post three for Saturday's GII TVG San Diego H. at Del Mar, which will be his first start since a dazzling last-to-first victory in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 25.

A record-setting winner of the GI Travers S. last term, the Juddmonte Farms runner followed suit with a gritty defeat of Horse of the Year California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in November. The Bob Baffert pupil captured the inaugural \$12-million GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. at Gulfstream in January and became North America's richest Thoroughbred with his win in Dubai.





As a former jockeys' agent, he used Thoro-Graph products to guide bookings for Gary Stevens, Patrick Valenzuela and Jose Santos. In the early online ADW days, he was the president of Youbet.com, and he later served as an executive at Xpressbet

and helped NYRA come up with ADW models that were the forerunners of last year's rollout of NYRA Bets.

Franklin said the launch of TGPS has its roots in a dinner meeting between Thoro-Graph and NYRA executives about four years ago where the question was asked, "What's the flaw with ADWs in general?"

A Franklin recalled it, "The answer that we all seemed to agree with is that ADWs had lost the personal touch. As the players had moved

away from the track to the remote betting environment, the umbilical cord between the player and the track had snapped. That's the sort of thing that we're trying to reinvigorate with that kind of personalized service, where the [players] really feel

comfortable with the people behind the scenes making their betting experience what it is."

The topic struck a chord with Thoro-Graph president Jerry Brown, Franklin said, and it sparked a discussion about "the lack of casino-style amenities and respect for the medium- and

upper-level horseplayer." Within the two companies, that conversation carried on long after that dinner was over

"Jerry, for his part in all of this, really feels an obligation to have a stronger-than-usual relationship with his customers, and is almost like their champion in some senses," Franklin said.

The idea crystallized over the course of several years, and last summer discussions began in earnest about a partnership. TGPS launched two months ago, and



while NYRA Bets will be its exclusive wagering service, TGPS is actively pursuing partnership deals with other racing associations that focus on delivering on-track perks and amenities to customers. *Cont. p4*

Franklin said he has good reason to think tracks will want to partner with Thoro-Graph: Its core performance-figure buying customers are dedicated, data-driven horseplayers whose volume of betting is far above the norm.


"The typical Thoro-Graph player, we're reckoning, is going to [wager] seven to 10 times the national average of betting than the regular, average ADW player," Franklin said, adding the caveat that he doesn't have enough of a customer base yet for TGPS to make a more precise prognostication about betting volumes.

"But we've already got hundreds of players who are going to annualize into many millions of dollars wagering," Franklin said.

"We'll be announcing more track partnerships in the next few weeks," Franklin said. "No track that we've asked has said no vet."

On the customer-facing side, Franklin said the interface for accessing NYRA Bets through TGPS is "100% identical" to the stand-alone version of NYRA Bets. The technology, customer service, and funding are all handled via NYRA Bets, and Franklin added that NYRA has dedicated 15 employees to make the partnership work.


"The idea is to give a personal level of service to [bettors] so that you can call somebody to help you out who is part of a really established relationship with you and knows your needs to help you with things like funding and rebates and going on-track," Franklin said.



If TGPS works as planned, Franklin is aiming for a win-win-win situation that involves the two partners and their customers.

Thoro-Graph wins by cultivating a stream of customers whose primary handicapping product-buying and betting actions will all take place via the TGPS interface. Even factoring in the discounted speed figure sheets and other items it will give away, the exponential volume of activity could mean a big business boost. *Cont. p5*

NYRA wins by starting betting relationships with upper-echelon players, and will benefit from gaining customer data that can be used to drive other marketing initiatives. If enough TGPS players take advantage of the incentives to come to the track, the partnership becomes a cost-effective way to lure big-volume bettors out of their homes and back to the on-track action.

Horseplayers win by collecting the growing list of perks and discounts. But Franklin also envisions that they will find great value on being treated with new levels of respect and courtesy.

Franklin said there is a fourth way horseplayers in general can come out ahead, even if they are not TGPS members: The feedback and constructive criticisms that TGPS players provide will be taken seriously, and he hopes to work with NYRA (and eventually, other partner tracks) to make sure the suggestions from bettors get acted upon.

"We've been given all of this valuable feedback by these hundreds of top Thoro-Graph players already," Franklin said. "God love 'em, they're so passionate. They let you know what they like and what they don't like. And we're already working with the NYRA Bets technology teams to implement a number of product enhancements that will benefit all NYRA Bets players, really."

Franklin said he was not at liberty to discuss specifics, but that several of those ideas already gleaned from customer feedback could be implemented by NYRA during the Saratoga Race Course meet.

"NYRA is very well aware that top players need top tools," Franklin said. "It's a direct line [for NYRA] to so many of the high-volume bettors. This is going to be an evolving program. As we get new input, we'll modify."

HORSEMEN REMEMBER BEN'S CAT

Wearing a bright orange shirt and helmet cover, Elizabeth Eckert went about her business as an exercise rider for Hall of Fame trainer King Leatherbury Wednesday morning with a heavy heart.

It was only the evening before that Eckert, working for Leatherbury at Laurel Park since December, had heard the news about **Ben's Cat** (Parker's Storm Cat), the recently retired Mid-Atlantic legend who was euthanized as a result of complications from colic surgery at the age of 11.

She drove to work in her dark blue 1992 Chevrolet Z-28 adorned with tributes to Ben's Cat. "R.I.P. Big Ben" was written across her windshield. Her side windows read, "The Cat!" while on the back window she wrote, "The Beast from the East. Rest Easy."

Naturally, the lettering was done in orange to match the silks of Leatherbury's The Jim Stable, for whom Ben's Cat ran his entire 63-race career that included 32 wins, 26 stakes wins, and more than \$2.6 million in purse earnings.

"Ben was an incredible horse. I was honored to ride him," Eckert said. "He taught me how to better listen to my horses underneath me. To hear what was going on [with him] broke my heart. Even though I only knew him a short time I loved him like I knew him my whole life.

"The Leatherbury team took great care of him when he was here, and I gave him all my effort every ride," she added. "I am happy to stand here today and say I was able to ride the beast of the east, Maryland's great Ben's Cat." *Cont. p6*

Horsemen Remember Ben's Cat cont.

Leatherbury, 84, bred, owned and trained Ben's Cat, retiring him June 27 just three days after finishing ninth by 4 1/2 lengths in the Mister Diz, a stakes the gelding had won six straight years from 2010-15. He was sent to the Versailles, K.Y. farm of Bayne and Christina Welker June 28, but developed colic that required surgery July 6 at the Hagyard Equine Medical Institute in Lexington, where he was euthanized July 18 due to post-operative complications.

"I was devastated. We thought he was going to be all right," Leatherbury said. "I thought he'd pull through, being Ben's Cat. He's used to winning, you know? To get that call saying he had gotten worse and they had to put him down, it broke my heart. I thought he would do it.

"It was a tragic ending to a magnificent horse," he added.

"Many times in a race I didn't think he'd win and then he got up.

I thought he was going to pull another one off, surviving, and he didn't. It is a horrible thing for me and for all of his fans and for the horse, of course. It's a shame."

Ben's Cat had his Mister Diz streak broken Aug. 20, 2016 by the unheralded John Jones, a 43-1 long shot racing first time off a \$25,000 claim for trainer Lacey Gaudet, whose family has long been synonymous with Maryland racing.

"When John Jones won the Mister Diz, I wasn't paying attention to the fact that I had just claimed this horse for \$25,000 and he won a stake and it was my first stakes winner as a trainer. It was, 'We just beat Ben's Cat,'" Gaudet said. "You never wanted to see a horse like that get beat and even when it was you, it was overshadowed.

"Every morning you'd go to the racetrack and you'd see him sitting there for 15 or 20 minutes before he got going. For a long time Doug Leatherman was on him and every morning people would jog by and say, 'Morning Doug. Morning Ben.' It was like you always knew he was going to be there," she added. "I cried when I found out. It's just sad."

Ben's Cat had only six different riders through his lengthy career, but it was Julian Pimentel that got on him more than anyone. Pimentel was aboard in 41 of 63 starts, including 30 in a row from June 2012 to November 2015.

Together, Pimentel and Ben's Cat won 22 races, 17 of them in stakes, topped by the 2013 and 2014 GIII Parx Dash, 2012 GIII Turf Monster, 2012 Maryland Million Turf Sprint, 2013-15 Mister Diz and Jim McKay Turf Sprint, and 2012-14 Fabulous Strike H.

"At the beginning of his career he was a little difficult in the mornings to train and stuff like that. He was like a student with a lot of growing pains," Pimentel said. "But as he got older he was just very cool. He knew what he was supposed to do. You look at his record and he'd win by a head or a nose--it was like he knew where the wire was.

"He could run pretty much on anything. He won on the slop, he won going short, he won going a mile," he added. "Going long wasn't his favorite distance but he did that a couple of times. He liked turf, dirt, the slop, it didn't much matter to him. I think he would run on concrete. He was just unbelievable."

Ben's Cat's last two victories came to start his 10-year-old season, taking an open 5 1/2-furlong allowance last May before his fifth triumph in the Jim McKay Turf Sprint. The closest he came to winning after that was in his 11-year-old debut, finishing fifth by less than a length in an April 16 allowance.

"At the Preakness this year, Todd Pletcher said to me that other than the horses he trains himself, of course, Ben was his favorite horse of all time," Leatherbury said. "The thing is, you have good horses come along all the time but they don't last. For him to last is where he created that 'People's Horse' thing.

"A lot of horses are so good that they retire because of their value in the breeding industry, and others have problems that knock them out early. They run a couple years and that's it," he added. "But Ben, year after year after year he'd come back and that's why he got that reputation. It is a sad end to the great Ben's Cat."

INTO MISCHIEF FILLY DOES IT 'JUST' RIGHT

There may not be a higher-quality filly maiden over the course of the next six weeks at Del Mar, and it was Debbie Lanni's Just A Smidge (Into Mischief) who went on to a narrow, albeit impressive victory to become Wednesday's second TDN Rising Star.

A \$39K KEENOV weanling RNA, the gray filly blossomed into a \$425K Fasig-Tipton Midlantic juvenile after covering a quarter mile in a co-fastest :21 2/5 and was knocked down to agent Donato Lanni, who told TDN Editor In Chief Jessica Martini that he was bidding on behalf of an undisclosed client.

Favored at 2-1 with \$2 shy of \$100,000 on her nose, Just A Smidge wasn't off the best and had to be hustled along by Rafael Bejarano, but she did so willingly and was alongside pacesetting **Tyfosha** (Flatter), the 5-2 second choice, as they hit the turn. The latter, runner-up to subsequent runaway Landaluce S. winner Surrender Now (Morning Line) on debut June 9, was not quitting down on the inside, but Just A Smidge was just that little bit better in the dying strides and had a 1 1/4-length margin on the line. Varanasi, the most expensive of Jimmy Creed (Distorted Humor)'s first-crop yearlings at \$385,000, was a distant third as the 3-1 third betting selection.

Just A Smidge is the second foal produced by Pooh Corner, who was purchased by Carolyn Vogel for \$105,000 at the 2010 Keeneland September sale. The mare is the dam of a yearling filly by Verrazano, foaled a filly by Stormy Atlantic this season and was bred back to Mshawish.



Just A Smidge is bred on the reverse cross responsible for the likes of Grade I winners Hansen (champion), Careless Jewel, Sweet Loretta and Tell a Kelly.

Owner Debbie Lanni is the widow of J. Terrence Lanni, the former chief of MGM Mirage and former partner in the legendary Baffert-trained Game On Dude (Awesome Again). Lanni did not get to see the victory, but listened to a call of the race from her friend Bernie Schiappa, who was also part-owner of Game On Dude.

"I am actually on a cruise between Finland and Denmark," Lanni said. "But we were well-represented there in the winner's circle by my son Patrick. I'm so excited and looking forward to her future and thanks to Bob Baffert for finding her."

Lanni parted ways with the fleet Reneesgotzip (City Zip) in 2015, selling her for an even \$1-million at Fasig-Tipton November to Shadai Farm while pregnant to Medaglia d'Oro. But it didn't take long for the bug to bite again.

"I told Bob I wanted to get back in and he said he'd look, told me to be patient. It's very exciting. What a great way to get back into it!"

Michael Pressley and Larry and Cindy Jones's **Kowboy Karma** (Kodiak Kowboy) swept to the front midway on the turn and streaked home to graduate by about a dozen lengths in Wednesday's fourth race at Delaware Park, becoming the newest '**TDN Rising Star.**'

Sent off the 17-10 second choice, the bay--bred and co-owned by the Joneses--was sluggish, under the whip and off the early pace as a three-way scrimmage for the lead developed up ahead. Given his cue with a touch less than three furlongs to travel, Kowboy Karma was past the half-mile in a slick :44 3/5 and widened from there, stopping the timer in a very fast 1:09 3/5.

The winner is the first foal from his dam, a daughter of SW & MGSP Alyssum (Storm Cat). Kowboy Karma's third dam is champion Althea (Alydar) while the further female family includes the likes of Grade I winners Arch, Acoma and Balletto (UAE). Just Jan's second produce is a filly by the Jonesconditioned Istan (Gone West).

LUCK NAMED EQUESTRICON 'RACING KEYNOTE' SPEAKER by Joe Bianca

Nick Luck, fresh off of helming the innovative and well-received NBC Sports Network live broadcasts from Royal Ascot, will be the 'Racing Keynote' speaker at the upcoming first inaugural Equestricon horse racing convention in Saratoga Springs. Luck will deliver his speech at 10:30 a.m. on the event's final day.

The convention, the first of its kind in the sport, will include more than 80 events, panels, attractions and exhibits. It spans three days Aug. 13-15. Day one, Sunday, will feature a handful of behind-the-scenes experiences at and around Saratoga Race Course, while the next two days, considered the General Session of the event, will be hosted exclusively at the Saratoga Springs City Center. Topics range broadly, with a diverse array of speakers, headlined by Luck and journalist Soledad O'Brien, who will deliver the "Aftercare Keynote" Monday morning.

A mainstay on NBC's Breeders' Cup telecasts, Luck published his thoughts after last year's World Championships on *Thoroughbred Racing Commentary* in a post titled "Ten reasons why things are looking up for American racing." His argument was that, despite a barrage of negative headlines about racing's future in this country, there was actually ample justification for optimism, including American horses' supremacy on world stages and positive developments in attendance and animal welfare.

Luck's post caught the eye of many in the racing industry, including Dan Tordjman, the co-founder of Equestricon who had done work with Luck for America's Best Racing leading up to the

Breeders' Cup. He and Luck discussed the bases for laying out a more positive, inclusive vision for the industry, and their talks led to Tordjman and his fellow co-founders offering Luck the keynote at Equestricon.

"I was very honored to accept," Luck told the *TDN*.
"They're an incredible forward-looking, optimistic, capable group of people who I'm very keen to support. I think Dan and some of the other organizers saw that what I'd set out to write in my article,

broadly speaking, tallied with their philosophy in starting Equestricon."

Regarding that philosophy, Luck continued, "I sensed a groundswell of optimism within American horse racing that perhaps hadn't been obvious in the 10-12 years I had been coming here for races. We had become accustomed to reading a lot of navel-gazing negativity about how the sport was on the downgrade and going to hell in a handcart. I didn't necessarily feel that was the case and I think that touched a nerve with Dan and his team."

The 39-year-old Luck is at an apex in his career that produced the groundbreaking opportunity to broadcast the prestigious Royal Ascot meeting to a nationwide American audience. NBCSN had Luck as its lead anchor at Ascot, accompanying the network's simulcast of British station ITV's well-staffed coverage of the meet. The week was difficult at times for Luck and the smaller NBCSN team as they tried to thread the needle between producing an American-geared telecast while still maintaining the uniquely British atmosphere of Ascot.

But ratings and reviews from fans of the coverage have been overwhelmingly positive, making the endeavor an exceedingly rewarding one for Luck.

"It was as satisfying an experience as I've had professionally," Luck said. "It was not without challenge, but I was really thrilled and staggered by the positive response from the U.S. Looking at it with Equestricon in mind, it was incredibly encouraging to have confirmed the suspicion that more and more racing fans, particularly the younger ones, look beyond the boundaries of their own nation when viewing horse racing as a sport."

Horse racing, for a niche sport, is an intricate and complex one, with myriad interests rubbing elbows and butting heads in search of a common goal--growth. Luck notes that one of the

things that drew him to
Equestricon was its attempt to
represent all of the game's
stakeholders in finding a more
balanced, natural approach to fan
development.

"I think what they're doing really well is they've gone to town with an incredibly inclusive agenda," Luck commented.
"They're embracing all the things that they love about horse racing. They're not simply saying, 'well, horse racing is not a product for the modern era, so therefore we have to fundamentally sell it on some abstract linkup with

popular culture.' What they're saying is 'we can use our own youth, enthusiasm and dynamism to sell what we believe in, in an entirely authentic way.' They're taking a bold, all-embracing view of the sport."

Equestricon also looks to give a more proportionate voice to one of the often overlooked principals of horse racing: horseplayers. There are nine scheduled events that focus on some aspect of handicapping races, part of a push toward representing the people fueling racing's purses that Luck believes is essential.

"They're not shying away from the fact that wagering is integral to the future health of the game," Luck said. "You can't pretend that the sport is going to exist and survive without people being enthusiastic, not just for the horses or the horsemen, but also for the prospect of winning a few dollars. That shouldn't be something that the sport shies away from or is ashamed of."

Luck added, "In an increasingly competitive leisure market and wagering market, you want people to think that horse racing is a stimulating enough challenge that they'd rather spend their dollars working out which horse is going to win the next race than on anything else."

Luck thinks that racing has a tendency to pigeonhole its patrons into two main categories, handicapper or fan, when the truth is that most consumers of the sport fall somewhere on a sliding scale in the middle.

"I sometimes feel that people perceive racing fans as either newbies who need to be attracted by hitching racing's wagon to whatever the latest popular culture fad is, or they're hardcore punters who sit in a darkened room all day looking at numbers," Luck said. "You've got to understand that 95% of people are in between those two extremes. It's this presupposition that people who wager don't have a sense of humor and people who like a bit of fun don't like a bet. If this convention works in any sense, it's because it's all-embracing. You have to embrace the whole."

Equestricon co-founder Kathryn Sharp said, "The whole premise of Equestricon is that we all start on equal footing. Whether you're a fan, a bettor, an owner, breeder or a racetrack executive, you'll be walking into Equestricon as someone with a perspective to share. This is an open forum for the free-flow of ideas and information; a safe space to listen and learn about the sport of racing. To be able to bring someone like Nick Luck into the building, with his range of experience in covering the sport all over the globe, is an incredible honor. We look forward to his keynote address with great anticipation."

A winner of 4,000 races during his riding career, Migliore spent the past six years working for the New York Racing Association, providing daily on-site analysis, and retired from that position July 8.



Sent away the 3-1 second favorite in Wednesday's openingday feature, Bowies Hero was given a beautiful ride by Tiago Pereira and finished fastest of all to take the event restricted to non-winners of a sweepstakes of over \$50,000 at a mile or beyond in 2017.

The two-back winner of Santa Anita's Singletary S. and exiting a good fourth to subsequent GI Belmont Derby hero Oscar Performance (Kitten's Joy) in the GIII Pennine Ridge S. at Belmont Park June 3. Bowies Hero was eased back into the latter third of the Oceanside field and was always hard held by Pereira. Allowed to improve a few spots as they prepared to swing for home, Bowies Hero was switched off heels and widest into the lane and stormed down the center of the track to outfinish the rail-rallying Pioneer Lad. Grecian Fire completed a good day for his late sire with a third-place finish.

"I was there with a lot of horse all the way around," the winning jockey said. "I had a big hold; he was strong. Tyler's horse [Pioneer Lad] made that run, but my horse went to him, then went right on by. He was very strong. And he'll run on."

In addition to his win in this year's Singletary on his seasonal return May 6, Bowies Hero annexed this track's Juvenile Turf S. last September ahead of an eighth in the Zuma Beach S. and an 11th to Oscar Performance in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.



Theresa Marnane's **Different League (Fr)** (Dabirsim {Fr}), who lowered the colours of 'TDN Rising Star' Alpha Centauri (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) in Royal Ascot's G3 Albany S. on June 23, will be set for the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville on Aug. 20. That race was won by last year's G2 Queen Mary S. winner and fellow 'Rising Star' Lady Aurelia (Scat Daddy), who was named Cartier champion 2-year-old filly and won this year's G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot.

Trainer Matthieu Palussiere said that while there have been offers coming in for the juvenile, she has not changed ownership.

"There's been no change in her circumstances," said Palussiere. "She's been very good since Ascot and now we are looking forward to the Prix Morny with her. We were all excited at Ascot and she confirmed there what we have thought all along: she's very good. She looks very good, she's some filly all right."

Different League, an €8,000 foal at Arqana December who was led out unsold at £14,000 at Doncaster's Premier Yearling Sale last year, won her first two starts in the French provinces, at Lyon Parilly on May 11 and at Angers on May 23, before upsetting the previously unbeaten Alpha Centauri in the Albany at 20-1.

WINX SET FOR MONDAY TRIAL

Australian Horse of the Year **Winx (Aus)** (Street Cry {Ire}) will trial on Monday ahead of her upcoming 6-year-old season. Winx, who rides a 17-race win streak that began in May 2015 and has encompassed 12 Group 1 wins, is expected to target a third Cox Plate win in October.

"She's good and we're getting close now to her first-up run," trainer Chris Waller told *Sky Racing*. "It'll probably be four weeks to Saturday so she has her first trial on Monday at Randwick. It'll just be a soft trial. I don't expect her to win or do anything special, she'll just follow them around. Two weeks later she'll have a second trial where she'll do a little bit more."

Like she did last year, Winx is set to start out in the G2 Warwick S. in late August.

"I couldn't be happier," Waller said. "It's just a matter of maintaining her, making sure she stays safe and holds her form."



Jockey Ana O'Brien, who was airlifted to hospital after a mount at Killarney on Tuesday evening, Druids Cross (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), suffered a fatal fall, will not require surgery for her injuries. The 21-year-old daughter of Aidan O'Brien was found to have a fractured C1 vertebra in her neck and T6 in her back, and fractured cheekbones bilaterally, but brain scans came back clear and MRI scans revealed surgery would not be required.

THE SOCIAL ANGLE

WITH FRANCIS GRAFFARD, TRAINER

More and more businesses in the thoroughbred industry are using social media to strengthen their brand and reach out to current and potential customers and clients. Chantilly-based trainer Francis Graffard shares his strategies for social media marketing.

TDN: What are the benefits of social media marketing for businesses in the Thoroughbred industry?

FG: Social media has different benefits, depending which channel you are using. Twitter is great for brief news items that can reach a more international audience, while we find Facebook a great 'fan' platform. Facebook is as much of a community for our employees and followers as it is a marketing tool, so we try and engage with that community a bit more.

TDN: What social channels do you prefer, and what type of content do you post on each platform?

FG: We're most active on Twitter and Facebook, and a little bit on Instagram. We tend to post a lot of the same content on Twitter and Facebook, but use English for Twitter and French for Facebook and obviously try to tell a bit more of a story with Facebook.

We post new content when we have something to say, usually results or news. We don't have any rules. In the winter, when the racing is a bit quieter, we try and post a few behind the scenes pictures and take advantage of the beauty of Chantilly at all times of the year.

TDN: Do you look at other organisations, inside or outside the Thoroughbred world, for inspiration?

FG: When we started, not really. We just came up with a vague plan to be present and tell our story, but now we do try and get ideas from outside the industry, just to freshen up what we're doing.

We don't have a marketing team or budget and I don't know many trainers in Europe who have the margins to incorporate that into their business so any ideas tend to be ones that we pick up on the fly. Video content is definitely becoming more popular so we'll try to put more of that in going forward.

TDN: Can you convert social media followers into customers?

FG: It certainly was a help when I set up a racing syndicate earlier this year. I think people looking to get involved in racing in a small way, such as via a syndicate or club, are more comfortable with someone who they feel they've gotten to know through social media.

TDN: Do you have any general tips for other businesses in the industry who are planning to start using social media?

FG: Just be yourself and be authentic. People are looking for authenticity and positivity. Don't underestimate how much people love horses and just love to experience the day-to-day life of a racehorse via social media.

TDN: What are the biggest mistakes to avoid making?

FG: Never post in a language that isn't your own unless you've had a native speaker proof-read it! Be open and honest but remember it's a professional tool. People want to get to know you, so be authentic, but professional at the same time, don't try and create a persona that doesn't exist. Keep grammatical and spelling errors to a minimum as they can look very sloppy.

TDN: Going forward, what social media trends are you looking forward to?

FG: I love that on social media you can watch a whole race-that's got to be a great benefit of our sport, the whole event can be easily shared and used to engage the audience.

LORD KANALOA HEADLINES RECORD SELECTION SALE By Kate Hunter

A week after a record-breaking JRHA Select Sale in Chitose, the Hokkaido Selection Sale in Shizunai kept the momentum going with a record-shattering ¥3,110,616,000

(£21,362,915/€24,161,725) gross and 81.4% clearance rate. This was the fifth consecutive year the Selection Sale has seen growth and the second year in a row of significant gains across the board, which has continued a fairly consistent decade of improvement. Leading the charge was the JRA's leading freshman sire Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}).

The 2013 JRA Horse of the Year has had a remarkable start to his stallion career, having four individual winners from 13 starters to date. Lord Kanaloa's results on the track and his progeny's physicals drove the market on Tuesday, with 12 of his second crop grossing ¥289,440,000 (£1,988,250/€2,248,226), which was ¥100,000,000 or more than any other stallion at the sale. He had the sale topper, a half-brother to multiple graded stakes winner Hakusan Moon (Jpn) (Admire Moon {Jpn}), who went for ¥47,520,000 (£326,429/€369,098) to Gaen Kogyo LLC. All of Lord Kanaloa's 12 sold went for over ¥10,000,000.

The progeny of well-established sires Harbinger(GB) and Kinshasa no Kiseki (Aus) also sold well during the one-day sale, grossing $$\pm 192,672,000\ (£1,323,660) = 1,496,525$)$ for 10 lots and $$\pm 170,100,000\ (£1,168,590) = 1,321,351$)$ for 12 lots, respectively. Both stallions have been consistently showing favourable results with each crop they produce. Black Tide (Jpn), the full-brother to Deep Impact (Jpn) who stands in the Hidaka region, grossed $$\pm 168,156,000\ (£1,155,235) = 1,306,250$)$ for 10 lots sold.

Since 2014, the Selection Sale--the Hidaka region's premier yearling sale--has seen across the board increases in gross, clearance, average and median. The gross in 2014 was \$1,852,956,000 and has broken that record every year since, though there was a \$600,000,000 increase from last year alone. The average and median have steadily risen but this year saw a significant increase, an average of \$16,905,521 (\$116,141/\$131,313) was up by 17.1% over last year, and a median of \$15,120,000 (\$103,874/\$117,444) was up by 33.3%. The clearance rate has risen steadily from 62.1% in 2014 to 73.5% in 2016, and jumped to 81.4% this year.

After the sale had finished, Hidaka Breeders Association president Mitsuki Kimura said a few words about the sale: "This is one of the best sales we have had here in the Hidaka area. We are always working to improve our sale, not only for the buyers who come but also to support the breeders of the Hidaka region."

Bolstered each year by the many Group 1 successes of the Hidaka-bred horses such as Maurice (Jpn), Kitasan Back (Jpn), Gold Ship (Jpn), Straight Girl (Jpn), Deep Brillante (Jpn) and Big Arthur (Jpn) (Selection Sale grad), the Hokkaido Selection Sale is developing a brand of excellence all its own.

EXPENSIVE SAVABEEL COLT DEBUTS A WINNER AT WARWICK FARM

Ultra Thoroughbreds' **Addictive Nature (Aus)** (Savabeel {Aus}), whose NZ\$775,000 pricetag was the joint third-highest at the 2016 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Yearling Sale, validated \$2.50 (3-2) favouritism to open his account at first asking Wednesday afternoon at Warwick Farm.

The Bjorn Baker-trained juvenile, winner of barrier trials at Rosehill (video) and Randwick (video), was a bit reluctant to load, but jumped neatly and put himself into the thick of the early battle beneath jockey Tim Clark. On the bridle throughout, the bay raced in the two path in a line of four off the home corner, kicked nicely when asked for an effort entering the final furlong and came away to defeat chief market rival Gold Standard (Aus) (Sebring {Aus}) by 1 1/4 lengths (video). Godolphin's Schubert (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}), a winner at Newcastle June 27, was third. The final time of 1:03.66 broke a 13-year-old class record

"He has shown us a lot so it's nice to see him put them away today," stable foreman Jack Bruce told *Racing NSW*. "We have been waiting a good year for that since we've had him. He is a real good looker and he has got the manners to match which I think is very important for a colt. He takes everything in his stride and even today before the race, how he handled everything, was very impressive." Cont. p12
